Your first encounter with Thai culture is usually with the bustling streets of Bangkok, a modern city with shiny shopping malls and a zippy sky train. All this is interwoven with devout Buddhist practices and breathtaking temples. To the north lies Thailand's second-largest city, Chiang Mai. As the country's bohemian centre, Chiang Mai and it's outlying hill-tribe communities are rich in tradition and culture. In the south, discover crystal waters and white sands on paradise islands and shores

Around 10% of the Thai people live in serious poverty with around 30% below the poverty line. Even so, Thailand is not as impoverished as many of its neighbouring countries. The main problem is the huge difference in income between the upper 30% and the rest, especially those living in rural areas, such as the exiled Burmese refugees and many indigenous Hill Tribes around Chiang Mai.

Life outside of the project

Your life outside the project will depend of which area you are staying. If you are volunteering on one of the islands in the south them there's plenty of opportunities for island hopping and diving/snorkelling in the crystal clear waters. Up in northern Thailand your free time can be spent exploring the stunning countryside and visiting small local towns for a true Thai experience. Wherever you are in Thailand there's sure to be a few temples nearby for you to admire on your days off!

Community and Conservation Volunteering in Chiang Mai Province

The project

Join us in Thailand and participate in Community and Conservation Volunteering in Chiang Mai Province. You will experience local life in this small community and get involved in a number of initiatives focused on community health, environmental conservation and education. This placement is located in a mountainous, rural area of Chiang Mai and includes diverse populations of ethnic Thais, Hmong, Lahu, Lisu and Karen peoples. The development levels vary between villages and the government struggles to provide healthcare, education and other services to support sustainable development in the face of environmental degradation. Volunteers have been working in this community for more than five years on forestry, development, basic health care provision, education and poverty reduction program. Volunteer and continue the progress of this important work.

Role of the volunteer

This is a multi-faceted placement and the role of the volunteer varies depending on the needs of the project at the time of your placement. The main activities are:

- Education support
- Community health awareness
- Environment conservation
- Supporting local health workers in the community clinic with basic duties such as administration, tidying and cleaning public spaces to alleviate the pressure on local healthcare staff

The environmental component includes tree planting and project development on a long term community based sustainable reforestation program. There is a public health outreach programme in place in the area and local teachers at the kindergarten are looking for support. The community placement will be decided by the local communities involved, but past projects have included, fixing a house for a vulnerable woman, improving and fixing the school, installing water supplies for remote villages.

Skills required

Volunteers applying for the community and conservation placement in Thailand do not need to be fully skilled. However, those with education, childcare or environmental experience or an interest in learning a little about healthcare will be most welcome. All volunteers must demonstrate flexibility and cultural sensitivity, as they will be working within a small community. You may be reporting to a number of different officials as part of this placement. You will be asked to submit a full CV/resume and attend a telephone interview before being accepted onto this placement.

Why choose this project



Support the project with their work, and share your skills, ideas and experiences with the children, adults and even elderly members of the community.



Participate in two-way cultural exchanges with the community while contribute in making a difference.

Project location

The project is located in a small Thai village in the mountains about an hour from Chiang Mai. The pace of life is simpler and more relaxed here and you will learn to go with the flow! Chiang Mai is the bustling capital of the north, surrounded by an ancient wall and moat. It is a shopping lover's paradise with night bazaars and a lively weekend market. Excursions include treks to visit hill-tribe villages, museums and temples. For the adventurous, try whitewater rafting in the Siam River. Those seeking a more relaxed time, can treat themselves to a Thai massage at one of the lovely local spas.

Elephant Welfare Project in Eastern Mahout Communities

The project

Based in Thailand's Eastern province of Surin, this project works with communities that have lived and worked with elephants for hundreds of years. Over time, work for elephants and their owners (known as Mahouts) has decreased and the lack of opportunities has left Mahouts impoverished and their elephants starved. To alleviate these problems, the government developed initiatives encouraging communities to use elephants to attract tourists to the area, but this led to entertainment shows, which force the elephants to perform and be subject to mistreatment.

This project takes a different approach, in order to generate more income to support this species and their owners. It currently houses 13 elephants and works alongside communities to encourage tourism development through ethical and responsible eco-tourism approaches. The project aims to create a better life for elephants, free from abuse, and to establish sustainably managed, free-range elephant tourism.

Role of the volunteer

Volunteers bring an international perspective to the work of conservation and ecotourism, passing along their knowledge and enthusiasm to local residents who will benefit the most from this work. Within the elephant village help is needed with looking after the elephants (walking, bathing, feeding), maintaining and harvesting crops to feed the elephants (sugar cane and bamboo) and general maintenance in the village (building elephant shelters, repairs, etc). Because the elephant's habitat is decreasing in the local area, volunteers will be required to help restore the animal's natural surroundings through reforestation. You will also have the opportunity to help explore ecologically sustainable and elephant friendly tourism options in order to create new and responsible forms of elephant based tourism, as well as learning about unethical elephant management practices.

Skills required

No specific skills are required for this project, but the love of animals is a must. Work is fairly physical therefore a moderate level of fitness will be needed. Volunteers must be friendly and flexible.

Why choose this project



Bring your international perspective on the project to benefit the local residents as they develop their ecotourism approaches.



Work with committed mahouts, their families and their elephants to enhance the standards of living in this community.



Build your CV / Resume by showing that you value animals' rights on a global scale.

Project location

The camp is situated approximately 50 km from the small city of Surin, which receives very few tourists. The area around the project is inhabited entirely by mahouts and their families. Volunteers have their own room (generally 2 per room) in a mahout family home, with an elephant (or two) living in the garden outside your door! You will be a stone's throw away from other volunteers living in separate houses next to your very own homestay and will eat communally in the centre square with other volunteers, with your food cooked by the families. Houses have electricity with fans and an outhouse with running water. Beds with mosquito nets are provided and volunteers eat together at the village's community centre.

This rural area has forested areas in which to go walking and onsite, whilst the elephant museum has a number of stalls selling snacks and gifts. At weekends, volunteers can take a public bus into the small city of Surin for a glimpse of authentic Thai rural life.

Gibbon Conservation and Rescue Sanctuary Volunteering in Thailand

The project

Do you have a soft heart for wildlife and possible primates? You've always been intrigued by Thai culture? And you want to help make a difference while discovering another country? Then, this is the placement for you!

The project protects gibbons and other local species that have been victims of abuse, or have been in contact with humans and been disposed of or injured and can no longer return to their natural habitats.

Gibbons are a small type of apes that live in the Southeast Asian tropical forests. They are one of the most threatened primates. Not only do they see their habitats disappearing due to deforestation, but they also get captured as babies to be sold as pets, killed to be used in traditional medicine practices, or used as tourist attractions. Poachers often shoot the parents so the small ones are forced to come down the trees, where they are captured. Like any wild animals, once gibbons have been in contact with humans, they cannot survive on their own in their natural habitats.

At the sanctuary, you will be exposed to a variety of gibbons species. However, because of its nature, the owners of the sanctuary have also accepted other species over the years such as macaque monkeys, jackals, a bear and even a bearcat! So you might get the chance to get acquainted with other species while on your placement!

Role of the volunteer

As a volunteer, you will provide the local staff with an extra hand. You will be preparing food, cleaning and tidying enclosures, as well as socialising with the gibbons. Food preparation is done twice a day in the morning and the afternoon. You will assist in preparing, distributing and feeding of the gibbons. Throughout the day, volunteers are asked to help with the cleaning of the enclosure. It's not a pleasant job, but someone has to do it! For safety reasons, you will not be allowed inside the cage. That said the tidying is done only underneath the cages. Socialising with the gibbons may sound like a straightforward job, but the value of it cannot be underestimated. Many of these gibbons have developed a fear of humans due to bad and negligent treatment. Making them comfortable around humans is crucial through activities such as "fluffing", imitating their calling "OoooooOOO", and holding their hands.

Those volunteers with the proper background may also be able to assist with the medical treatment of the gibbons when necessary.

Skills required

A compassionate attitude towards animals is of course required for this project as well as a can-do attitude! Rabies vaccinations are strongly advised for this project.

Why choose this project



Get involved in rescuing Gibbons and providing them with a safe and comfortable environment as they cannot be returned to nature as they would be in extreme danger if returned.



Make the gibbons comfortable with human interactions and help them regain the trust they have lost while being mistreated or injured.



Gain invaluable practical experience in working with animals that you wouldn't otherwise have the chance to interact with.

Project location

This is a very rural location based in the jungle where you will be able to enjoy the peaceful surroundings amidst lush jungle and mountain landscapes.

This is the perfect location for those who enjoy trekking! The closest town of Mae Sot is about 50 minutes drive and shares its border with Myanmar. Otherwise, there are books in English available as well as a TV room with a varied selection of DVDs which you can enjoy during your spare time.

Island Marine Conservation with International Diving Certification

The project

Based on the Thai island of Koh Tao, this marine conservation project is perfect for divers or those wishing to learn to dive while contributing to sustainable development for the sea and local communities. Working on its own initiatives and also in association with other dive companies, the Thai Navy and the Marine Fisheries Department, the project aims to build artificial reefs, culture a giant clam nursery, study seahorse populations and undertake regular monitoring activities in the waters surrounding the island. The project works with local schools, teaching some children how to dive responsibly. Education is essential in the local communities, and volunteers and interns help by spreading the word about the importance of marine conservation. The data collected on the project is used by government environmental agencies to make policy decisions. This project includes internationally-recognised diving qualifications and certifications in a range of Conservation Courses in topics such as Artificial Reef Theory and Techniques, Ecological Monitoring Program or the Coral Predators course. If you are developing your diving skills, you will receive SSI (Scuba Schools International) training from beginner to advanced level. If you are interested in PADI, this can also be arranged for an additional fee.

Role of the volunteer

As a volunteer, you will start every day by attending a lecture on your course of action for the day. Following this, you will proceed to your diving duties. Whilst diving, you will be responsible for identifying species, monitoring the reefs, underwater clean-ups, and reef restoration. You will also receive diving instruction to help you progress your diving certification. There are a range of projects that you may be able to help with including:

- Growing new colonies from fragments to help increase the coral population
- Studying coral spawning or drupella snail numbers
- Participating in seahorse research
- Monitoring the presence of Crown Thorn Starfish, a species that feeds on coral
- Caring for rescued turtles through feeding scheme, weighing and surveying their growing progress

Skills required

Volunteers are accepted on this project with a range of skills and the most important is the ability to swim a minimum of 2 lengths of a 25-metre swimming pool. Volunteers must love water and be interested in sea life. Even a beginner can join and make a difference to marine conservation. All volunteers must have a moderate level of fitness as everyone will be required to carry tanks and equipment during their placement.

The course includes SSI certifications to be built on your current level of experience. For example, a beginner will be able to acquire Open Water, Advanced and Conservation Diver certifications. Depending on the length of your placement and skills levels you may be able to progress onto more advanced levels.

Learn about monitoring and clea

Learn about monitoring and cleaning of the reefs, removing damaging debris and identifying changes

Help the project and its partners in their efforts to preserve local underwater habitats.

The southern bay of Chao Lok on the island of Koh Tao is a heaven for divers. With over 40 dive schools on the island, this small village, away from the main tourist area, has all the benefits of internet cafes, restaurants and book shops, without the crowds. Your delightful guesthouse, on the seafront, has a restaurant, internet cafe and Thai massage area, runs yoga classes as well as a laundry facility and travel shop if you need help booking excursions to nearby Koh Pha Ngan or Koh Samui. For those of you wanting to go further afield, head south to Krabi & Koh Pi Pi Island or head north to Bangkok to explore the temples, markets and all that the busy capital has to offer.

Work with Rescued Elephants, Reforestation and Rural Communities

The project

Volunteer in northern Thailand on an elephant rescue and reforestation project based in a rural community just outside Thailand's second largest city, Chiang Mai. The project works with three elements of the local community: an elephant camp which is an eco-tourism project supporting sick and old elephants who are not able to work as well as unemployed Mahouts (elephant trainers) to provide both with better opportunities, homes and food. A reforestation project works to restore and maintain the local jungle damaged by local practices, and also to work with the community to change their behaviour to make better use of their resources. Finally, the project also works with local schools to provide the children of this rural community with an opportunity to develop English, environmental, and leadership skills. Come and volunteer on this project working with both animals and the local community for a truly amazing experience.

Role of the volunteer

Volunteers bring an international perspective to the work of conservation and eco-tourism, passing along their knowledge and enthusiasm to local residents who will benefit the most from this work. Within the elephant camp help is needed with marketing, developing materials and English learning. In the community jungle, tree planting and building water system for the replanting of trees and firebreaks is important and within the schools, there is both the need for people to help with building and water sanitation labouring work as well as the schools education program - teaching English, environmental and leadership skills.

Skills required

No specific skills are required for this project, but any background or training in forestry, environmental sciences, tourism or similar fields is a bonus. Experience in teaching can be an advantage and any experience in marketing would also help.

Why choose this project



Contribute to supporting the local community and their future as this niche project has been supported by the very dynamic local governor of the region to revitalize it and fight poverty in the area.



Get involved and help build an understanding of what appeals to the tourists, as well as improve the local community workers' language and communication skills.



Provide an extra pair of hands as manpower is needed for the labour-intensive jobs of reforestation, camp maintenance and improvement of the school facilities.

Project location

The project was set up by a local man who was concerned about the way animals were being treated in the area. Because of this, he set up an animal rescue centre and eco-tourism camp. On this project, you will stay in the same comfortable eco-tourism lodges that the tourists visiting the camp stay in.

The camp is located around 45 minutes drive away from Chiang Mai. Founded in 1296, Chiang Mai is constructed as a square with a moat to mark its boundaries and safeguard the people within with a bastion at each corner. Today, these landmarks remain to form the overwhelmingly unique character of the city. It is here where you will spend the first couple of nights, acclimatising and receiving orientation. Take your time to familiarise yourself with this beautiful city, the capital of the north of Thailand.

Agriculture, mainly fruit, vegetables and some rice cultivation, is the mainstay of the local economy. In the past 10 years, tourism has become an increasingly important economic growth point for the city. Other industries include cottage industry, handicraft production, exporting, small-scale business and manufacturing.

LGBTQ NGO Development Internship in Thailand

The project

Join us on this LGBTQ NGO development Internship in Thailand and use your English to support a locally led internationally supported organisation. While Thailand is more accepting than most other countries around the world, the LGBTQ community faces discrimination. There are no rights for those in same-sex marriages and prejudices at schools and in the workplace is widespread. In Chiang Mai, there are large numbers of transgender men and women as well as sex workers and other at-risk groups. In 2004 increasing HIV prevalence rates led the organisation to promote local initiatives, with advocacy and education at its heart.

The work of the organisation is widespread. The NGO staff educates, promotes inclusion, and offers testing and counselling at schools, spas, saunas and bars. The aim is to improve acceptance by others, encourage safe sex practices and even reduce teenage pregnancy. Rights and safe sex messages are important to the organisation and activities include HIV/AIDS outreach, education, treatment and prevention as well as advocacy. Join us and make a contribution to the LGBTQ community and other at-risk groups in the city of Chiang Mai.

Role of the Intern

Interns will become a part of the office staff and support the local organization with their community and online activities. This is a professional well run organization, and interns will need to add value on top of meeting their own learning goals. You will see how initiatives are planned and implemented. Interns become part of the office staff and support organizations with fundraising, report writing, and marketing including website and social media updates. You will also develop the capacity of the organisation by teaching the local staff English. In addition, there may be chances to see public health outreach, HIV / STI testing, education and other grassroots work with transgender men and women, and at risk groups.

Skills required

On this LGBTQ NGO development Internship in Thailand, you will use your writing skills and grasp of English. You should have completed at least your first year at university on a relevant course or have some experience. Areas such as proposal writing, teaching, marketing or public health are preferred. You must be flexible, patient and able to work in a multicultural team supporting transgender men and women. You will be supported by professional and experienced staff who have an excellent command of English. Please bring a laptop with you to document your learning during your internship. You will be asked to submit a full CV/resume and attend a telephone interview before being accepted onto this placement.

Provide practical support to those who are working with the LGBTQ community and other vulnerable groups and be involved in human rights in Thailand



Share your own stories as well as learn about those of others in the LGBTQ community.

This internship is based at an NGO in the northern Thai city of Chiang Mai. Chiang Mai is a culturally diverse destination and it is very popular with international tourists. Medical Internship at a District Hospital in Chiang Mai

The project

Use your healthcare training and consolidate your studies by joining our medical internship at a district hospital in Chiang Mai in northern Thailand. District hospitals in the area serve a populations of between 60,000 and 80,000 people but are only staffed by around 3-5 doctors and 30-40 nurses. The community itself is very diverse and the doctors and nurses support remote mountain communities, including minority hill tribe groups, refugees and migrants as well as providing ongoing care to some of the poorest areas in Thailand. Despite all the challenges faced, the Thai public healthcare system is often held up as one of the best in the region and it is, therefore, a great place for an internship, as not only can you observe the approaches to overcoming these challenges you can also experience first-hand its successes.

Thailand has effective public health care outreach, HIV/AIDs prevention and treatment, vaccination, and non-communicable disease programs. Despite this, there are many ongoing problems with high rates of teen pregnancy, increasing levels of non-communicable disease and contagious disease. Hospitals provide a range of services including emergency care, x-ray, laboratory, in-patient wards, OBGYN, pharmacy, ECG, dental, eye-care, pre and post op care. With staff shortages, it is often difficult to imagine how these services are delivered and an internship in Chiang Mai will demonstrate the approaches taken to do so.

Role of the Intern

Medical interns in Chiang Mai can shadow and learn from the staff at the hospital. Resources provided by volunteers can help the staff to reach and support disadvantaged populations. All interns will participate in personal research and activities designed to increase reflection and support their learning.

Depending on the location of your placement, your internship may include shadowing in the ER, OBGYN, pharmacy and other departments of the hospital. Simple testing of patients and other hands-on tasks will depend on the skill level of the participant and their own personal efforts while in country. All interns will be supported to complete their own reflection and research projects.

Skills required

For this internship placement in Chiang Mai, it is primarily shadowing in nature and it is, therefore, suitable for those who are studying medicine, healthcare or nursing. It is not suitable for those with no prior knowledge of healthcare. It is also difficult for qualified physicians due to the registration requirements that enable volunteers to practice - please speak to a Kaya Advisor if you want to know more. You will be working with a local team and cultural sensitivity and good team working skills are important. You will be asked to submit a full CV/resume plus supporting documentation relating to your studies and attend a telephone interview before being accepted onto this placement. Please bring a laptop with you to record your learning during your internship.

Experience a range of illnesses and ailments common in the developed world and their challenges.

Temple School Construction & Renovation in Thailand

The project

On this project, you will be volunteering your time to the temple schools in a rural community in Thailand. The temple schools provide food, housing and education to the local communities' children that don't have the resources necessary at home, are left with no parents or whose family are so impoverished that they can't take care of them at home. It also welcomes children that live in remote areas and have no access to education. These temple schools also provide a home for children from hill tribes communities, allowing them to be considered for Thai Citizenship, which otherwise they wouldn't, and therefore would have no access to healthcare. The schools welcome between 250 to 300 children and are controlled by the monks and the teachers. Most large temples schools in Thailand have integrated their own primary (and secondary) school onto their grounds and this project is no exception. The classrooms may seem old and a bit dirty. Which is why this project needs your help!

You will start your project with 1 week dedicated to learning about Thai Culture through cooking and language lessons, visits to the most famous sights around Central Thailand as well as meeting locals and bonding with fellow participants. This is a great way to get introduced to your new country, its culture, traditions, history and lifestyle before getting you started on your volunteer work.

Role of the volunteer

As a volunteer, your work will consist of construction and renovation work that improves the facade and structures of the school and elevates the living standards for all the children who attend. The project

Program Agreement, Terms and Conditions

Thank you for choosing to apply for placement on a Kaya programme. We are committed to providing you the best support as you prepare for the experience of a lifetime, which is why we have laid down the following terms and conditions. By checking the agreement of these terms and conditions you have accepted to abide by the rules laid down in this agreement, and we suggest that you read the details carefully and speak to us if you require any further clarification. Please note there may be additional conditions that apply to individual placements.

Program Agreement Terms and Conditions

NOTE: The current terms outlined include temporary accommodations made to address the current Covid-19 global pandemic. We have called these Kaya Amended Coronavirus Terms – Kaya ACT. These temporary terms are outlined alongside Kaya regular terms and conditions and may be amended at any time. These are all shown in red for easy identification.

Deadlines, Dates and Prices

Applications are accepted throughout the year and are subject to limited space availability. Programs are priced individually and displayed on the Kaya website alongside each project. Deadlines are based on the dates of the desired placement. Some programs and project placements fill up prior to their published application deadlines. Apply early to secure your space. Important deadlines for the Kaya Programs are:

Early Application

Application can be made up to 1 year in advance, however, arrangement and communication of the program specifics will commence 2-3 months prior to program start.

Application Deadline

Programs have varying deadlines. Most are around 3 months prior to the program start. Last-minute bookings will be considered on an individual basis. Last-minute bookings are advised that their placement arrangements may require more flexibility to accommodate.

Total Fee Due

60 days prior to program start – unless specified for a particular project

Late Payment

Payment deadlines are displayed on the invoices provided. It is important to meet these deadlines to secure your placement, and missing these deadlines may result in the cancellation of your placement. Where a payment extension is requested, this will be considered on a case-by-case basis and will incur a late payment fee of £35/\$60 basis.

Program Start and Finish Dates, Current Prices, and "What's Included" are displayed on the Kaya website alongside each project. Details shown on printed materials are subject to change. Projects prices are reviewed annually and bookings for the following year may differ from those listed. Payments may be made in GB£ or US\$.

Application Instructions

At the time of initial application, an application fee of GBP£75/ US\$95 is requested. This fee will be deducted from your total program fees. This is a non-refundable fee that enables us to process your application and ensures we work to match you with the best possible placement for your skills, interest, and needs. In the event that the application is rejected by Kaya, this payment will be returned in full. You will be provided the option to "speak to an advisor before submitting your fee", but please note that your application may not be completed until payment of this fee is received.

Upon receipt of the application form and fee, we will contact you to arrange an online interview, work with our in-country teams to review your information, and offer you a placement in line with your request. Kaya will contact all applicants within 2 weeks of receipt of the application.

Confirming your placement: Once a placement is offered, you will have the option to confirm your placement and dates, and reserve your space with a confirmation fee of GB£150/ US\$250. This fee will be deducted from your total program fees.

Kaya ACT: During the Covid pandemic, this payment will not be requested until travel to that country is possible (the host country borders open to you, and your home country is allowing travel to the host country). These will be deferred until confirmation of travel dates can be provided, at which time applicants may decide whether to proceed with, or cancel their application.

Until your confirmation fee is received we cannot guarantee your space on the program. See Trip Cancellation & Refund Policy below for further details.

Additional deposit fees: A small number of our programs have an additional deposit applied by our in-country project partners. You will be notified of this on initial inquiry if this exists for your program. Any payments made will be applied toward the total program fee. These additional deposits are non-refundable in all cases but can be applied to future participation for that specific placement if your placement dates need to be moved.

Trip Cancellation & Refund Policy

Kaya reserves the right to cancel any program if there are insufficient registrants (where minimum numbers apply) or if Kaya determines it is in the best interest of the applicant's safety and quality of programming to cancel the program. Kaya is not responsible for other costs incurred by applicants preparing for the trip. Should a program be canceled by Kaya, for any reason, applicants will be offered the option of positions in other Kaya Programs or a full refund on all fees paid, minus application fees and bank charges.

For participants wishing to cancel or shorten their program, the following terms apply:

- Application fees are non-refundable in all instances for successful applicants. Unsuccessful applicants will be fully refunded.
- Additional deposits, where applicable, are also non-refundable in all instances.

- If the Participant cancels for any reason, the Participant must notify Kaya in writing. The cancellation will be effective upon receipt of the written notification by Kaya to info@kayavolunteer.com. Careful planning goes into developing volunteer and intern programs for every individual applicant. As a result, Kaya and our host communities and partners incur substantial administrative and planning costs, including accommodation reservation fees, prior to the start of each program.
- Kaya strives to ensure sustainable projects and quality programs for Participants. The Refund Policy is defined in an effort to protect and accomplish these goals. Kaya deals with each situation fairly, in consideration of well-established policies, and with the best interests of community members and Participants in mind.

Date and Project Changes

Upon application, you will receive an interview in which your placement and program dates will be discussed. When you confirm your placement and pay your confirmation fees, we will agree program dates against which your placement will be held. We encourage you to stick to these as the projects plan around your participation. Under standard terms, one (1) date or program change made prior to 60 days before departure will be accommodated for, at no charge, subject to availability. Placements moved to the following year may be subject to price increases. After 1 change has been accommodated for, any future changes made will be subject to an administration charge of GBP£40 / USD\$70 – payable at the time of change. Participants asked to leave under these circumstances will not receive a refund. In addition to other program responsibilities, as a program participant you are responsible for:

- Being in sufficient good health to undertake the program.
- Acting in an appropriate and respectful manner towards the local people, fellow travellers, program participants, and staff in accordance with the customs, laws, regulations, and ordinances of the country of placement.
- Following all health and safety protocols and precautions outlined by ground-team members.
- Communicating effectively your interests, skills, limitations, and needs to home community members and program staff members.

Disclosure

All participants must disclose at the time of application any pre-existing or existing medical conditions (including depression and eating disorders) and disabilities. Some placements may require doctor's notes as a requirement for participation - some of which may be dictated by legal requirements or liability purposes. Any medical conditions arising after Application and prior to Placement must be disclosed to Kaya prior to placement commencement. Kaya reserve the right to refuse applications based on these disclosures, if deemed necessary for the safety of the participant and the project. Kaya operates a policy of non-discrimination and any information provided that may impact an application will be discussed with the applicant prior to any decisions being implemented to establish the basis for any concerns. Kaya reserve the right to cancel any application, or terminate a placement without refund if false information or lack of disclosure is found to have been supplied. Kaya is not held responsible for the administration or monitoring of any medication. While Kaya makes every effort to establish safety conditions and risk assessment, Participants are warned that the general standards of health, safety and hygiene in many countries visited may not be of comparable standard to Western countries and hence a risk of injury and illness is inherent to this venture.

Some placements may require a police criminal background check, conducted by the government. This check shall be carried out at the applicant's expense with guidance from Kaya. Some placements require proof that volunteers are clear of certain medical conditions, through the provision of a health certificate. This check shall be carried out at the applicant's expense.

Complaints

If a Participant wishes to lodge a complaint in relation to their program, they shall first bring the complaint to the attention of the in-country coordinator, who will make reasonable efforts to deal with and, where possible, resolve the complaint within a reasonable time. If a Participant feels that a complaint is not being dealt with adequately by their in-country coordinator they should then contact the Kaya placement advice team to escalate the issue. If the coordinator is unable to resolve any serious complaint, and the participant chooses to terminate their placement early and depart the project, they shall provide the coordinator with a written version of events leading to their early termination, prior to departure. Refunds cannot be provided for early departure unless extreme circumstances are found, which will be determined at the sole discretion of Kaya. Issues reported after the end of a program that were not reported during the program, giving the site team an opportunity to address the issue in country, will not be considered for any compensation. Participants agree that Kaya shall not be liable for damages or compensation relating to any claim regarding inconvenience, disappointment, discomfort or loss of enjoyment.
