COSTS

DETAILS

We have worked closely with our in-country teams in 5 locations - **Ecuador**, **Morocco, South Africa, Vietnam, and Thailand** - to develop virtual internships that will support capacity-building projects for organizations tackling social or environmental issues in their local communities.

Not only will students gain relevant cross-cultural work experience and boost their resumes, the results of their work will make a long-lasting impact in a community in their host country. Alongside their project placement, students will engage in interactive cultural workshops and connect with a local buddy their age to enhance their cross-cultural understanding of the host country.

You can trust that each internship will be aligned with Kaya's mission to promote sustainable social, environmental and economic development.

Internships are available across a range of academic areas including:

- NGO Management, Business Development, Entrepreneurship, Social Enterprise, International Development
- Law, Immigration, Human Rights, Anthropology, Environment and Sustainability, Public Health, Education, Research, Women's Empowerment
- Marketing, Communications, Media, Journalism

Other academic areas may be available upon request.

English speaking placements are available in all locations. Placements are also available in Spanish (Ecuador), French (Morocco) or Arabic (Morocco) for students with language skills.



Online Language & Culture Program

COSTS

USD\$1285 per person for 8 weeks

Additional language classes: USD \$55 for 2 hours/week or USD \$100 for 4 hours/week

DESCRIPTION

We are offering a package of 2 hours/week of one-on-one language classes over the course of 8 weeks in **Morocco** or **Ecuador**, paired with our series of 8 pre-recorded cultural workshops, and 8 chats with a local buddy (one-on-one or in a small group). Language classes are offered through our partner language schools.

Spanish is available in Ecuador, and **French** and **Arabic** are available in Morocco. A **Mandarin** option is in development and more information can be provided upon request.






DESCRIPTION

Virtual cultural workshops led by our Country Directors are an engaging alternative to in-person evening and weekend cultural activities with locals. Cultural workshops are excellent opportunities to bring the world into the classroom for faculty members who would like to supplement their academic coursework with perspectives from locals. Workshops are typically 1 hour long.

SET WORKSHOPS

In **Morocco, Ecuador, South Africa, Vietnam, and Thailand** (the locations where Kaya currently offers these workshops as part of our virtual internships), the following set cultural workshops already are already available for pre-recorded or live sessions:

- **Food and Culture** such as local cuisine, food traditions, markets, dining habits and a cooking demo
- **Relationships** family structures, dating and friendships
- **Communications** the nuances of real life communications such as slang, greetings, body language, direct vs. indirect communication and the importance of storytelling
- **Traditions** traditions, folklore, legends of different cultural groups and generations, and how they are honored today
- Modern Culture dance, music, sports, hobbies and entertainment
- **Healthcare** an overview of the healthcare system, health risks, and wellness
- Work Culture exploring social and power dynamics, workstyles, behavior and etiquette, and cultural expectations
- **Travel and Tourism** how to get around like a local, where the locals go, and places you can't miss when visiting the country


CUSTOMIZED CULTURAL WORKSHOPS

Local Buddy Chats

COSTS

DESCRIPTION

Our network of university-aged local buddies around the world are eager to continue connecting with U.S. students for language or cultural exchange! Local buddies will meet with a small group of students virtually to chat informally about their lives and culture. Our local buddies love learning about U.S. students too! Kaya will provide optional topics and prompts for discussion, such as food traditions, relationships, and modern culture, or students and classes can create their own questions and discussion topics.

Local buddies are available in Morocco, South Africa, Eswatini (formerly Swaziland), Ghana, Tanzania (Zanzibar), Zimbabwe, Zambia, Vietnam, Cambodia, China, India, Nepal, the Philippines, Sri Lanka, Thailand, Ecuador, Peru, Bolivia, Belize, Costa Rica and Jamaica.

CONDITIONS AND CONSIDERATIONS

One on one buddies may be available in some locations upon request and will have a different pricing structure depending on location, number of buddies needed, time zone, etc.

Time zones will need to be taken into consideration when choosing times for the buddy chats and may require some flexibility.

With Kaya's in-country presence, we have a wide network of local experts and community leaders across NGOs, human rights and social justice, conservation and environmental studies, healthcare and more. If there are themed topics or other academic areas that you would like to explore in Kaya's location, we can provide samples upon request. There is great potential for comparative lectures from experts in different countries!

Remote Site Visits

COSTS

Site visits are customized to meet your unique needs, requirements, and budget. Costs will vary based on the type of organization, location, and time commitment required of their staff and community members.

DESCRIPTION

Within our lens of community development and sustainability, we can set up site visits with local organizations, schools, fair-trade businesses, etc. For best quality we recommend that once an organization is identified the class outlines their objectives and questions, so that the organization can pre-record walk-throughs and interviews with the key players who will help the class meet their objectives. This may be followed by a live Q&A session.

Group Field Projects or Research are customized to meet your needs and requirements. Inclusions such as cultural workshops, local buddies, and language classes can be incorporated to enhance the experience. Costs will vary based on the program design and elements you wish to include.

DESCRIPTION

Kaya's community partners around the globe have reached out asking to stay connected with students who would normally be assisting with projects on the ground. With the help of students remotely, these initiatives can continue to move forward. We can we can connect groups of students to organizations in nearly all of our countries where students will be contributing to a capacity-building project over an extended period of time. Remote projects and research are an excellent way to connect theory to practice, and all while supporting a worthy cause!

All group field projects or research will include an orientation. We believe that to be a responsible traveler - especially a remote one - cultural context is key! We strongly recommend adding-on cultural workshops and will work with you to find the best solution that meets your time and price requirements.


Large groups may need to be split into smaller groups within the same organization or amongst several organizations.

Gap and Bridge Programming

COSTS

DESCRIPTION

Kaya has been offering Gap Years for more than a decade. Traditionally, a Gap Year is taking time off for a period of 3 to 12 months, before or after studies, in between jobs, or as a career break. A gap year is not just "time out" to do nothing, but it's "time in" to experience something different and create reflection in between stages of life. Many find that it is a journey that sparks passion and helps guide them to the right life path for themselves.

As more graduating high school seniors reconsider starting their college career straight away and current university students weigh whether to continue their studies if the experience is remote, Kaya is here to help you consider Bridge and Gap Programming that will help you convert and retain students at your institution. Kaya can work together with multiple departments such as the Global Office, First Year Experience, and Admissions to develop Gap programming under your university brand with the aim of keeping students engaged and in the pipeline for enrollment.


